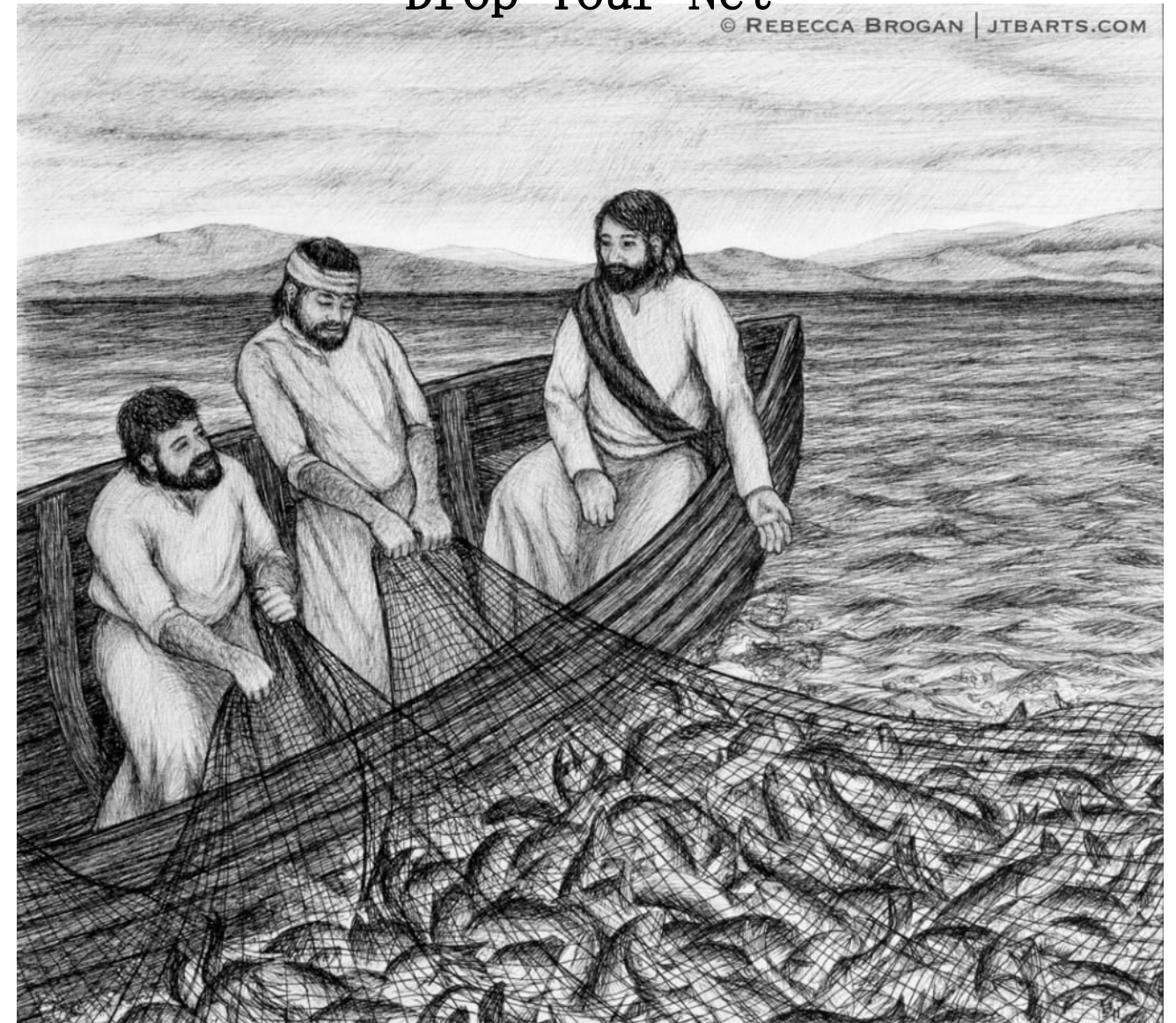

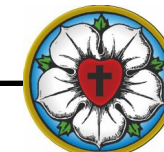

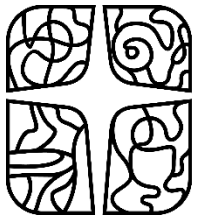

AS WE GATHER

Today we hear the “hook” God used to attract Isaiah as His prophet. With him, we are moved to respond, “Here am I! Send me.” Like Paul, we have a “line” to reel in people who might otherwise stray; we are called to speak clearly to be about the task of “building up the church.” But we are not called to introduce them to a sinker who will weigh them down, for Jesus has risen! Now He sets us up to “fish” for others, replacing their empty lives with God’s overflowing, eternal bounty. Today we let the Word move us into action, to use the hook and line God provides to follow our Lord and catch others for the One who has risen above our every weighty sin and empty life and calls us to follow.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION *Luke 5:8; 1 Corinthians 14:14; Isaiah 6:5, 7*

Pastor: Seeing Jesus' power, Peter blurted out, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord."

People: **Heavenly Father, we confess that we have failed in thoughts, words, and deeds; we are sinful people.**

Pastor: Paul lamented, "If I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays but my mind is unfruitful."

People: **We confess, Holy Spirit, that we have been content to find peace only for ourselves; we are sinful in our very being.**

Pastor: Isaiah cried, "I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips."

People: **We confess, Lord Jesus, that we have sinned even in our speaking and doing; we deserve to have You depart from us.**

Pastor: Despite their failures, Isaiah and Paul were inspired to write parts of the Bible and Peter led the disciples. By the grace of God, Jesus died and rose for you. As the angel told Isaiah, "Your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for." As a called and ordained servant of Christ, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: **Amen. Help us, Lord Jesus, to follow, calm and fearless, till our rest is won.**

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Isaiah 6:1–8* (God calls Isaiah to be a prophet.)

¹In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ²Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. ³And they were calling to one another: “Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory.” ⁴At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke. ⁵“Woe to me!” I cried. “I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the Lord Almighty.” ⁶Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷With it he touched my mouth and said, “See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for.” ⁸Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, “Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?”

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord. **People: Thanks be to God!**

EPISTLE *1 Corinthians 14: 12–20* (Our words must not be for ourselves alone, but for the building up of the church.)

¹²So it is with you. Since you are eager for gifts of the Spirit, try to excel in those that build up the church. ¹³For this reason the one who speaks in a tongue should pray that they may interpret what they say. ¹⁴For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays, but my mind is unfruitful. ¹⁵So what shall I do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will also pray with my understanding; I will sing with my spirit, but I will also sing with my understanding. ¹⁶Otherwise when you are praising God in the Spirit, how can someone else, who is now put in the position of an inquirer,^[a] say “Amen” to your thanksgiving, since they do not know what you are saying? ¹⁷You are giving thanks well enough, but no one else is edified. ¹⁸I thank God that I speak in tongues more than all of you. ¹⁹But in the church I would rather speak five intelligible words to instruct others than ten thousand words in a tongue. ²⁰Brothers and sisters, stop thinking like children. In regard to evil be infants, but in your thinking be adults.

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord. **People: Thanks be to God.**

HOLY GOSPEL *Luke 5:1–11* (Jesus calls Peter to fish for men.)

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the fourth chapter.

People: Glory to You, O Lord.

¹One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret,^[a] the people were crowding around him and listening to the word of God. ²He saw at the water’s edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. ³He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat. ⁴When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, “Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch.” ⁵Simon answered, “Master, we’ve worked hard all night and haven’t caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets.” ⁶When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break. ⁷So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them, and they came and filled both boats so full that they began to sink. ⁸When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus’ knees and said, “Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!” ⁹For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken, ¹⁰and so were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, Simon’s partners. Then Jesus said to Simon, “Don’t be afraid; from now on you will fish for people.” ¹¹So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him.

Pastor: This is the Gospel of the Lord. **People: Praise to You, O Christ.**

SERMON "Drop Your Net" Luke 5:1-11

CREED *Nicene*
